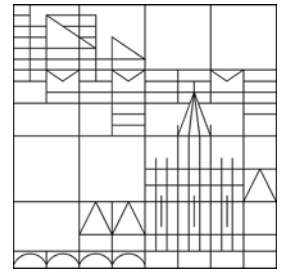

Information: Drug, Goods or Commons? Value added- and transformation processes on information markets

The transformation of information markets proceeds rapidly: commons-based exchange markets, particularly in scientific environments, public free markets as well as commercial markets intermingle more and more. New information products and services with value-added effects are continuously developing, just as well new business and organisation models. Markets are intensively regulated by technology (DRM) and by copyright and patent laws, thus mainly protecting intellectual property rights and increasingly restricting free access.

The ISI2009 conference is a joint event of the German Higher Education Association for Information Science (HI) (http://www.inf-wiss.uni-konstanz.de/infwiss/index_en.html) and the luK (luK-I) (cf. <http://www.iuk-initiative.org>). ISI 2009 will take place at the University of Konstanz (<http://www.uni-konstanz.de/>), organized by the chair for information science (http://www.inf-wiss.uni-konstanz.de/start_e.html).



Call for Papers – Deadline Oct, 17th – ISI 2009 – Konstanz - 1.-3. April 2009 -

HI, being a science and education organisation, is primarily interested in science-based and education-related contributions in all areas of research, whereas the IuK- Initiative mainly encourages contributions with respect to the promotion and development of domain-specific information and to the transfer of knowledge.

Contributors should specify for which part of the conference their paper is intended.

Particularly desired are papers with the following topics, but also those which cover any subject in the broader field of information science including neighboured disciplines such as computer science, economy science, economics, law, political and administration science, psychology, or linguistics.

- Information markets – value added products and services, modes of regulation
- Commons-based exchange forms – a new paradigm for information society and a potential for innovation in the information industry
- Business and organisation models for the publication of knowledge and information
- Who owns knowledge? Who or what controls information access?
- Developments in research and practice of information retrieval, search engines and the automatic processing of text and data
- Visualization – reproduction of fantasy, picturing of reality, facilitating of knowledge access
- Social services in web 2.0 – motivation, quality control, organisation forms
- Collaborative work in e-science and e-learning – consequences for knowledge management and for concepts of authorship and creativity
- Information competence for information professionals
- Information ethics and politics, e.g. privacy vs. security, digital divides, sustainability of knowledge, access to knowledge

Papers written and to be presented in English are welcome.

Submission

You can submit four types of contributions:

1. Long papers (10 - 12 pages)
2. Short papers (3 – 5 pages)
3. Poster (1 – 2 pages)
4. Panel proposal (1 – 2 pages)



1. and 2. Long/short contributions

The contributions have to be original unpublished works. They should be uploaded in electronic form (MS Word/RTF-Format, ODT) using the conference tool – [<http://ocs.boxxed.net/index.php/isi/isi09/schedConf/cfp>] . Peer reviewing will be provided by at least two members of the international program committee.
